SCHOLARSHIPS AND PRIZES

Merriam Music Outstanding Solo Performance PRIZE: Tuition Scholarship ranging from \$50-\$100

Open to all Merriam School of Music students participating in the MSM Competitive Festival. Recipients must receive a mark of 90% or more and must be nominated by an adjudicator to qualify for the scholarship. Each adjudicator will nominate performers who demonstrate a thorough understanding and excellent interpretation of their piece, in conjunction with outstanding proficiency in the instrument. Nominees will have their video performance reviewed by the Festival Scholarship Panel to determine final winners of the award.

Merriam Music Most Promising Voice Student PRIZE: One (1) \$300 Tuition Scholarship

Open to all Merriam School of Music students participating in a minimum of three (3) vocal categories (Category 701-715). Scholarship will be awarded to the performer with the highest average between 3 vocal categories. Recipient must receive an average mark of 90% or more. All nominees will be reviewed by our Festival Scholarship Panel to determine a final winner.

Intermediate Keyfest Piano All-Around Performer PRIZE: One (1) \$150 Tuition Scholarship

Open to all Merriam School of Music students participating in a minimum of three (3) Intermediate Keyfest Piano categories (Category 513-514, 518-526, 551-552, 557-558, 560-561, 570-571). At least one of those categories must be a jazz/pop category (Category 557-558, 560-561, 570-571). Scholarship will be awarded to the Intermediate piano performer with the highest average between the 3 piano categories. Recipient must receive an average mark of 90% or more. All nominees will be reviewed by our Festival Scholarship Panel to determine a final winner.

Advanced Keyfest Piano All-Around Performer PRIZE: One (1) \$200 Tuition Scholarship

Open to all Merriam School of Music students participating in a minimum of three (3) Advanced Keyfest piano categories (Category 527-532, 553, 559, 562-563, 572). At least one of those categories must be a jazz/pop category (Category 559, 562-563, 572). Scholarship will be awarded to the advanced piano performer with the highest average between 3 piano categories. Recipient must receive an average mark of 90% or more. All nominees will be reviewed by our Festival Scholarship Panel to determine a final winner.

Senior Keyfest Piano All-Around Performer

PRIZE: One (1) \$250 Tuition Scholarship
Open to all Merriam School of Music students
participating in a minimum of three (3) Senior
Keyfest piano categories (Category 533539, 554, 564-565, 573). At least one of
those categories must be a jazz/pop category
(Category #564-565, 573). Scholarship will
be awarded to the Senior piano performer with
the highest average between 3 piano categories.
Recipient must receive an average mark of 90%
or more. All nominees will be reviewed by our
Festival Scholarship Panel to determine a final
winner.

Merriam Music Exceptional Artist Piano Award PRIZE: One (1) \$300 Tuition Scholarship

Open to all Merriam School of Music students participating in a minimum of three (3) Artist Piano categories (Category 540-550, 555, 566, 567, 574). Scholarship will be awarded to the performer with the highest average between 3 Artist Piano categories. Recipient must receive an average mark of 90% or more. All nominees will be reviewed by our Festival Scholarship Panel to determine a final winner.

Merriam Music Stand-Out Rock/Pop Performance (Guitar/Percussion scholarship) PRIZE: One (1) \$200 Tuition Scholarship

Open to all Merriam School of Music students participating in a guitar or percussion category (Category 301-304, 307-309, 401-403). Scholarship will be awarded to the performer with the highest mark in a guitar or percussion category. Recipient must receive a minimum mark of 90% or more. All nominees will be reviewed by our Festival Scholarship Panel to determine a final winner.

Merriam Music Stand-Out Classical Performance (Classical Guitar/Strings/Woodwinds scholarship)

PRIZE: One (1) \$200 Tuition Scholarship
Open to all Merriam School of Music students
participating in a classical guitar/strings/
woodwinds category (Category 305, 306,
311-314, 801-813, 601-607). Scholarship will be
awarded to the performer with the highest mark
in a classical guitar/strings/woodwinds category.
Recipient must receive a minimum mark of 90%
or more. All nominees will be reviewed by our
Festival Scholarship Panel to determine a final
winner.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Registration

Please read the <u>How To Register</u> section at the back of the syllabus for registration deadlines and fees. All registration fees are non-refundable.

It is the responsibility of the teachers and parents to check the eligibility of the competitors and the selection of their pieces.

Competitors may not use the same piece in more than one category, nor may they perform a piece they have performed in any previous Merriam Festival competition.

A confirmation email including your scheduled day and time will be sent to the email address submitted with your registration. Session start times may vary to accommodate the number of participants.

All competitors must be registered students with the Merriam School of Music at the time of their performance.

Memorization

Guitar, Percussion, Piano, Strings, Voice

Memorization is compulsory for these instruments unless otherwise noted. Competitors not playing from memory will receive comments only from the adjudicator. No mark or placement will be awarded.

Woodwinds

Memorization is not compulsory for woodwind categories.

Music Submission and Copyright

Guitar, Piano, Strings, Voice, Woodwinds

Performers are required to submit a copy of their sheet music and their audio accompaniment tracks (where applicable) using the members.merriammusic.com/exam-festival link. Sheet music must be submitted two weeks prior to the performance date, and tracks must be submitted no later than two days before the performance date.

Percussion

Performers are not required to submit sheet music if a published version does not exist; otherwise, the same rules as for other instruments apply.

All Instruments

All performers must demonstrate proof of ownership of any sheet music being used. Photocopies are strictly prohibited and will be cause for disqualification.

Accompaniment

Strings

All songs must be performed with a track or piano accompaniment.

Voice

All songs must be performed with a track or piano accompaniment. For the Pop/Jazz categories, competitors may also accompany themselves. Please note, this will not be considered as part of the mark for the category.

Adjudication and Awards

Performers arriving late to a session may be permitted to perform, but will only receive comments from the adjudicator. If the adjudication has already begun, they will not be considered for placement.

Students who leave before the end of their session will forfeit their chance for placement and scholarships.

First, second, and third place awards will be handed out by the adjudicator at the end of each category's performances.

Written adjudications will be emailed to each student within 5 days of their performance.

Adjudicators must not be approached during or after a session, and their decisions are final. All questions and concerns should be submitted by email to festival@merriammusic.com.

Students related to any Merriam employee are not eligible for Festival Scholarships.
